As is my custom, I always recap the Oaks and the Derby day cards. Earlier in the week, rain was predicted for the Oaks card but the system slowed and didn't hit the area until very late in the card and thus didn't affect any of the races. Let's see how things turned out.

## *Selections For Race 1*

<i>Most Likely to Win</i>	3	Shred the Gnar (5-2)	Only has to replicate last out win to beat these. Moves up on off track.
<i>Value Plays</i>	5	Sierra November (8-1)	Improving with each race. Moves up on off track.
<i>Bombers</i>	6	Talent Show (30-1)	Tries dirt after three starts on TP syn.
<i>Heads Up</i>	1 4	Anonima (3-1) Chasten (2-1)	Both of these fillies are taking a major class drop and get Lasix but they hold no speed fig advantage.

SHRED THE GNAR was an easy wire winner at 3-5.

<i>Most Likely to Win</i>	4	Defiant Lass (4-1)	On Oaks and Derby days stick with locals on the undercard. This one is set up to graduate and should move up on an off track to boot.
<i>Value Plays</i>	3 5	Saucier (6-1) Endorse (8-1)	Blinkers on for stretchout to route for top connections. Shows only average pedigree for off tracks. Tough to win around 2 turns with FTS but this one is bred to run long AND to excel on an off track.
<i>Bombers</i>	1	Joyous Song (12-1)	Bred to win. first time out but only avg off track pedigree. Bug jockey won for Mott previously at 32-1.

Two in a row for my MOST LIKELY as DEFIANT LASS scored at 9-2.

<i>Most Likely to Win</i>	11	Vivaldi (5-1)	Ran 2nd off a 16-month layoff. Plenty of time to recover. Top turf trainer. Colt is NOT bred for OFF TURF.
<i>Value Plays</i>	6	World Beater (6-1)	His Beyers jumped when Riley moved him to the turf, the surface he is bred for.
	10	Some Performance (9-2)	At 9-2 not the greatest of value for this Euro invader that gets 1st Lasix but trainer bats 50% with runners right off the plane.
	12	Moon Channel (6-1)	Tough post but colt is bred for turf and to run all day. Had trouble in his debut.
<i>Bombers</i>	7	Mighty Mike (30-1)	This colt is well bred for turf and showed improvement when moved to the sod. Trainer has saddled just one runner at the last three CD spring meets...and scored with that runner at 20-1. Good enuff for me!

VALUE PLAYER WORLD BEATER topped MOST LIKELY VIVALDI for a \$25 exacta.

She had made that move earlier in the year winning the Santa Ynez at 7f. The issue was that her speed fig in the Santa Ynez was painfully slow. But big bucks showed on the tote knocking her down from 12-1 ML to 7-1 as they left the gate. For me, this was one of those “head scratcher” winners.

AG BULLET attended the early pace and faded. Not her day.

Last year at this time, my table was set with Pick 5 will pays ranging from \$92k to \$1 million. But this year, the Oaks Pick 5 looked chalky so I passed on the wager. And I was correct. It was chalky. Plus the rain had finally hit and the track was listed as wet fast. I thought LA CARA would zoom to the lead and wire the field on the off track. So I keyed her.

As is my custom, I always print *Twilight Zone* exacta and trifectas for these big races. This angle is based on the concept that history repeats itself. So I religiously analyze the relevant preps. It costs me some bankroll \$\$\$ but I’m way ahead over time.

LA CARA did go the lead but was pressed by Bob Baffert’s TENMA. They went way too fast and each was cooked by the time they hit the stretch. Heavy favorite GOOD CHEER swept past the leaders and won by daylight over two longshot closers—DREXEL HILL and BLESS THE BROKEN.

Earlier in the campaign GOOD CHEER had won the Rachel Alexandra and BLESS THE BROKEN had run 3rd. So I played that one back with ALL in the middle and caught a nice \$360 trifecta multiple times. Love that *Twilight Zone* angle.

<i>Bombers</i>	4	Yellow Brick (20-1)	Use only if the track is OFF. Ran huge in slop at CD last fall. Fast track is just 14-1-4-3. Pieces.
